Healthy Eating Talk with Hillary Dowling

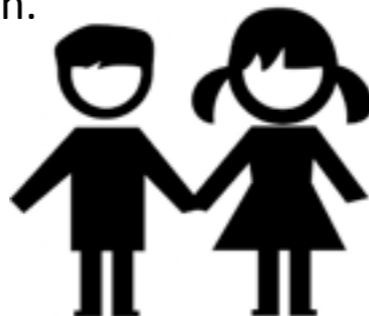
