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Dear Parents/Guardians

Each one of us has a duty to protect children from harm and the *Department of Education and Skills* (DES) published the **Child Protection Procedures for Primary Schools in 2017** to give direction to school management and staff regarding the identification of and response to child protection concerns.

The *Board of Management of Scoil Chéile Chriost Rathmore N.S* has already adopted these procedures as school policy and a copy of our *Child Safeguarding Statement* is available to view on the school website or a hard copy is also available to read in the school office.

Please note that the *Designated Liaison Person (DLP)* in place for dealing with child protection concerns is the school **Principal, Lucy Travers** and the *Deputy Designated Liaison Person (DDLP)* is the **Deputy Principal, Caitríona Lancaster.** We appreciate your co-operation with the following procedures which are in place:

- A requirement for **all visitors** to Rathmore N.S. to report to the school *Reception Office* where they will be asked to sign-in and will receive a '*Visitor*' badge.
- Parents/guardians are asked not to proceed directly to classrooms when collecting children early from school but to wait at Reception and their child will be escorted to meet them there. Our school Secretary **Martina** is always happy to assist you with any query.
- A reminder that all parents/guardians who are actively involved in any school activities such as the school Library, Tours, Matches and Sports Day activities must be vetted. All details on Diocesan Vetting requirements can be obtained from **Martina** in the School Office.

Hope you all have a very happy and safe Hallowe'en! The school will re-open after the mid-term break on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> November.

# School Admissions & Junior Infants Enrolment 2023-24

As a result of the *Education* (*Admissions to School*) *Act 2018* which has now been enacted and applies to school admissions from September 2021 in both primary and secondary schools, our school Admission Policy has been updated to incorporate these changes. Parents/guardians and the school community will be advised of the enrolment period for Junior Infants for the 2023/24 school year when our Rathmore N.S. Admission Notice is published in December. If you know of any 'new parents' in the parish who wish to enrol their child in Junior Infants for the 2023/24 school year, you might bring this information to their attention.

# **Covid-19 Public Health Guidelines**

Please continue to adhere to Public Health Guidelines in relation to Covid-19 and preventing the spread of infection The key messages are as follows:

- Please keep your child at home if he/she is unwell. The best way to keep viruses out of school is to stay at home until symptoms have substantially resolved for 48 hours or contact your GP for further advice if necessary.
- We are continuing to **maintain our now established hygiene routines** in school in relation to handwashing/sanitisation.
- Children are reminded to **adhere to good respiratory etiquette** by covering a cough and sneezing into their elbow. It is advisable that each child has a small packet of tissues which can be kept in their bag for their personal use in school.
- Good **ventilation** continues to be maintained in all classrooms.

# **Teacher Supply Shortage**

It has been reported in the media by school management bodies and the teacher unions that there is a national teacher supply shortage in Irish primary schools with many schools unable to fill advertised teacher vacancies for this school year. The teacher shortage has been communicated to the Department of Education and Skills (DES) and we await an update re alleviation measures. There is also an acute shortage of available substitute teachers to cover teacher absences where sub cover is provided by the DES. This problem is affecting schools in both the Dublin and Kildare areas and has been compounded by the cost of rental accommodation and rising fuel costs.

Fortunately, all advertised teacher vacancies in Rathmore NS were filled by the Board of Management for the 2022-23 school year following a recruitment process. However, in common with other schools in Kildare and despite our best efforts, we have been experiencing difficulties in sourcing substitute teachers. Please note that in the event that a substitute teacher cannot be recruited to cover a teacher absence on a day where substitute cover is provided by the Department of Education, a class may have to be split. We hope that the Department of Education will put measures in place to support school Management at this challenging time.

#### School Mass

A school Mass to mark the opening of the 2022/23 school year was celebrated by **Fr. Comer** in the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Eadestown, on Friday, 23<sup>rd</sup> September and was livestreamed through the parish webcam to all the classes in the school. Thanks to our readers from 6<sup>th</sup> class, **Oisín Malone, Oísín Carew, Oscar Magee and Dylan Lawlor** and their parents for providing transport to the Church and to teachers **Ms. Gleeson** and **Ms. Roe** for the musical accompaniment in the Church which really added to the Mass.
