The daily 'Nuacht' agus 'An Aimsir' will be read aloud over the school intercom by the children. There will also be a 'Gaeilgeoir na Seachtaine' prize for pupils who make a big effort to speak 'as Gaeilge', culminating in our annual Tionól (Assembly) on Thursday 16th March which will take place outside in the school yard.



Glasnevin Experience Tour




I am pleased to advise you that the *Department of Education and Skills (DES)* have agreed to continue their partnership with **Experience Glasnevin** and three classes from Rathmore N.S. (6th Class, 5th Class & $4^{th}/5^{th}$ Class) have been invited to participate in the **Exploring Multiple Narratives Programme**.

This Programme is part of a unique educational partnership between *Marino Institute of Education*, *Trinity College and Glasnevin Trust.* It explores Irish History between 1912-1923 and involves both classroom and Experience Glasnevin components and is strongly linked to the SESE Primary Curriculum. Through on on-site engagement, inquiry-based learning, accessibility to sources, it is hoped to positively and significantly support the teaching and learning of History.

Pupil Use of Mobile Phones



Please note that as per our *Acceptable Use Policy*, pupils are discouraged from bringing mobile phones to school but, if necessary, mobile phones must be switched off during the school day and not used while on the school premises/grounds.

Students are not permitted to use phones/smart watches as cameras under any circumstances in school, on school trips or during extra-curricular activities. The school will not be liable for the replacement of lost, stolen or damaged devices. Pupils who take unauthorised photos or recordings of other students or staff members will face disciplinary action as per the school's *Code of Behaviour*. The school incorporates this policy into the *Code of Behaviour* and will treat breaches as they would treat any other breach of the Code.

This topic is very much in the news and parents/guardians are advised to be vigilant and supervise their child's use of mobile phones outside of school hours. Children should avoid setting up or participating in Class *Whatsapp* groups. Please note that the administrator of a *Whatsapp* Group is responsible for the content shared on the group chat.

REMINDERS

UNIFORMS: Please note that the school uniform is inter-changeable and pupils can wear either the uniform or school tracksuit to school. However, all children in 6th class are required to wear the <u>full</u> <u>school uniform for *Confirmation*</u>. Your class teacher will advise on what days P.E. is taking place when your child should wear the school tracksuit. Please ensure that your child has a <u>light, rain-jacket or coat</u> for school and remember to check that all items of school clothing are <u>clearly labelled</u> with your child's name.

GARDA VETTING: As part of Child Protection Guidelines, it is a requirement that all parents helping out with school activities are Garda-vetted. This process is confidential and once the initial application is submitted by the school, the process is online for the applicant. Therefore, parents/guardians who may become involved in school activities such as Sports Days, Tours, Swimming, Library, School Garden, Matches or who wish to help out with children in the school must first be *vetted*.
