Roll Out of School Hot Lunch Scheme in Primary Schools

Welcome back to the new school term and wishing you and your families a very Happy New Year in 2024.

The Government announced in the October Budget that the Department of Social Protection (DSP) would be extending funding to provide *Hot School Meals* to all primary schools beginning with the first group of schools from April 2024.

I pleased to inform you that **Rathmore N.S.** has been included in the first round of primary schools who will be part of this fully funded Scheme. Each pupil in the school will receive a free nutritious hot lunch every day in school beginning in April 2024 from an approved hot lunch provider.

The Board of Management are currently in the process of finalising the administration of the Hot School Meal Scheme with the Department of Social Protection and Parents/Guardians will receive information and further details on how the Scheme will operate in the school in the near future.

Junior Infants Enrolment 2024/2025 School Year

The Board of Management have published our **Annual School Admission Notice** in respect of admissions to **Junior Infants Classes** for the 2024/2025 school year. Our **School Admission Policy** is available to view on our school website at www.rathmorens.ie

It is very important to note the dates which are applicable for admission to <u>Junior Infants Classes for the 2024/2025 school year.</u>

The school began accepting completed **Application Forms** for Junior Infants 2023/24 on 8th **January** 2024 and enrolment will close this Friday, 19th January, 2024.

Please note that failure to accept an offer, or to return a completed **Application Form** to the school, within the prescribed period outlined on the *Admission Notice* may result in the offer being withdrawn. A completed **Application Form** must be submitted in the required time period even if you have submitted a completed Form of Inquiry earlier in the year.

School Attendance Campaign

Attendance is recorded daily by your child's class teacher using the online roll book on *Aladdin*. If your child is absent from school, you can update the reason for absence yourself using *Aladdin Connect* and/or inform your child's class teacher with a note in the school diary. A record is also maintained on *Aladdin* of children who are late to school or leave school early. Please contact **Martina**, our school secretary in the school office if you require assistance.

Every school is required by law to submit an Attendance Report twice yearly to TUSLA, the Child and Family Agency. There are two reporting periods in the year – September to December and January to June. We are required to submit a list of all pupils who have missed 20 school days for any reason and each absence should be explained.

The overall aim of school attendance and punctuality procedures is to ensure each child maximises their learning time in school and misses as little time as possible, unless of course, there is a valid reason such as illness and/or medical appointments. Educational Research shows that there is a direct link between school attendance and pupil progress in school. *Parents/Guardians are discouraged from taking their child/children out of school for other reasons during term time.*

The Department of Education and Skills (DES) recently launched a National School Attendance Campaign to improve school attendance in Ireland following a noticeable dip in attendance figures since the arrival of Covid-19.

Reminder Additional School Closure 23rd January - Primary Maths Curriculum

A reminder that the *Department of Education and Skills* have notified us of an <u>additional school closure</u> this **Tuesday 23rd January 2024** to facilitate teacher continuous professional development for the new *Primary Maths Curriculum* which will be implemented in schools during the 2024/25 school year. The school will be closed to pupils on that day and will re-open as usual on Wednesday 24th January.

HSE Free Flu Vaccine For Children

The Health Service Executive (HSE) is asking parents of all children aged 2 to 17 to get the nasal spray flu vaccine. Children are twice as likely to get the flu as adults, so the HSE is offering the vaccine free of charge to all children in this age group. Parents can bring their children to get the vaccine from their GP or pharmacy. The flu spreads easily from person to person and can cause serious illness in children. A free appointment can be booked with your GP or pharmacist.

The most important measure is to keep your child at home if he/she is unwell. While many children have a runny nose or a slight cough in the Winter season, if your child is feeling unwell, s/he should stay at home until the symptoms have finished. <u>1: Plastic free Fridays</u>
