Fáilte go Seachtain na Gaeilge 2024. Tugunn sí deis iontach dúinn ar fad níos mó Gaeilge a labhairt. 'Seachtain na Gaeilge' gives us an opportunity to use our native language daily in school. It's really important to 'Bain úsáid as do chúpla focal' and display a positive attitude to Gaeilge. The theme for the Festival this year is 'possibilities' and we are all asked to look at the possibilities with Irish and all the wonderful things we have because of our native language.

We are having ceol, cluichí agus craic to celebrate our culture in school during 'Seachtain na Gaeilge'. There are a variety of fun activities and competitions planned to encourage greater use of our native language among the children such as a Comórtas Seanfhocail, (Irish sayings competition), Comórtas Dathucháin (Colouring competition) Ceolchoirm and the singing of our national anthem 'Amhrán na bhFiann', 'as Gaeilge'.

The daily 'Nuacht' agus 'An Aimsir' is being read aloud over the school intercom by the children. There will also be a 'Gaeilgeoir na Seachtaine' prize for pupils who make a big effort to speak 'as Gaeilge', culminating in our annual Lá Glas agus Tionól (Assembly) on Friday 15th March which will take place outside sa chlós. Míle buíochas do Mary Ryan of Kilteel Comhaltas who has given of her time to come into the school and practise with the children for an Irish music performance on the day.

Friday, 15th March has been designated as "Lá Glas" when all children can wear green to school/dress in a St. Patrick's Day theme. Many thanks to all our teachers and staff for coming together to make it a special week to remember in Rathmore N.S. but especially to our Gaeilge Team of Aoife Malone (5th / 6th Class), Ms. Doyle Sen Infants) and *Mr. O'Brien* (4th Class) for co-ordinating the week of activities across the school.



New Hot School Lunch Programme



As previously advised, the Government announced in the October 2023 Budget that the *Department of Social Protection* (DSP) would be extending funding to provide **Hot School Meals** to all primary schools beginning with the first group of schools in Term 3 of the 2023/2024 school year. **Rathmore N.S.** has been included in the first round of primary schools who will be part of this fully funded Scheme. This service will begin on a date to be confirmed by the lunch provider after the Easter holidays in Term 3.

Hot lunch provider, *The Lunch Bag* has been chosen to provide the hot meals to the children in **Rathmore N.S.** and two separate documents from *The Lunch Bag* were recently shared with parents/guardians providing information on the hot lunch ordering process, how the service will operate in the school, along with information on the variety of menu options available.

School Attendance Update



National School Attendance Campaign

Our school attendance for the month of **February 2024** has shown an improvement on the same month in 2023 with an attendance figure of **93.7**% compared to **90.8**% for the same month in 2023. Overall pupil attendance rates in Rathmore N.S. are up since the beginning of the 2023/2024 school year with a **93.8**% attendance rate compared to **92.7**% for the 2022/2023 school year. Well done everybody and let's keep it up!

The overall aim of school attendance and punctuality procedures is to ensure each child maximises their learning time in school and misses as little time as possible, unless of course, there is a valid reason such as illness and/or medical appointments. Educational Research shows that there is a direct link between school attendance and pupil progress in school. *Parents/Guardians are discouraged from taking their child/children out of school for other reasons during term time.*

School Calendar 2024/2025

The school Calendar for the 2024/25 School Year (next year) has been finalised and has been emailed out to all parents/guardians.



The Big Sing is an inclusive celebration of joyous music drawing from popular music, family Disney hits as well as ceol as Gaeilge, alongside a chosen focus on another musical heritage. The show is centred around the children themselves performing all together and provides an opportunity for primary school children aged 8-12 to perform in the *National Stadium*, alongside celebrity performers and young cultural leaders. The show aims to provide a platform for children, who may not otherwise have experienced the joy of performing in front of a live audience in a large professional venue.

Gleeson has been busy rehearsing with the children in her after-school choir on Mondays during this school year and they will join with other schools in performing in the *National Stadium*, *Dublin* on the evening of April 15th next. REMINDERS

UNIFORMS: Please note that the school uniform is inter-changeable and pupils can wear either the uniform or school tracksuit to school but may only wear the school shorts for sports training or during the Summer Term/fine weather. All children in 6th class are required to wear the <u>full school uniform for Confirmation</u>. Please ensure that your child has a <u>light</u>, <u>rain-jacket or coat</u> for school and remember to check that all items of school clothing are <u>clearly labelled</u> with your child's name.

GARDA VETTING: As part of Child Protection Guidelines, it is a requirement that all parents helping out with school activities are Garda-vetted. This process is confidential and once the initial application is submitted by the school, the process is online for the applicant. Therefore, parents/guardians who may become involved in school activities such as Sports Days, Tours, Swimming, Library, School Garden, Matches or who wish to help out with children in the school must first be *vetted*. All details on Diocesan Vetting requirements can be obtained from Martina, our school Secretary in the School Office.
