# Safety in the School Car Park

A big thank you to all parents/guardians for co-operating with our car parking arrangements to ensure the safety of all.

Children should not enter the school building before the Garden Gate is opened to receive pupils arriving by bus from 8.45am as there is no supervision in place. The school day begins at 9.00am and ends at 2.40pm (1.40pm for Infant Classes)

# Late pupils should enter through the main school entrance door at Zone A.

Please do not leave your child unattended on the school premises as we cannot take any responsibility for their safety outside of school hours.

- Please remember to park **in reverse** in a designated parking bay and stand beside your car to await collection of your child.
- No parking is permitted on the roundabout or along the school driveway outside of the marked spaces. This facilitates cars to enter and leave the school car park and also provides the necessary space for buses to enter and leave safely.
- You are welcome to use the overflow car park to the rear of Rathmore Community Hall if necessary.
- Please be **vigilant at all times**, as young children are liable to run behind cars if they are not properly supervised. Once children are collected, they then become the **responsibility of parents/guardians**.

# Home/School Communication: Rathmore N.S. Homework Diary

The Rathmore N.S. Homework Diary is the main channel of communication between home and school and the teachers check it daily for any messages written in it by parents/guardians for their attention.

We kindly request that you do not contact your child's class teacher directly by email unless absolutely necessary. Teachers will do their best to respond to your query within school hours up to 4pm daily. It is important that all parents/guardians ensure that their contact details are up to date.

# **HSE Back To School Advice**

The Department of Education and Skills (DES) have issued some information to schools as the new year commences regarding back-to-school advice and a letter from Dr. Abilgail Collins, HSE National Clinical Lead, Child Public Health was sent to parents via Aladdin. The key messages are as follows:

- 1. Ease anxieties and worries. Check-in with your child about how they are feeling about school. It is normal for children to feel worried or anxious around this time.
- 2. If your child is unwell, keep them at home. Many children might have a runny nose or a slight cough as the seasons change. However, if a child is **feeling unwell**, they should be at home. For example, if your child:
  - Has a fever (a temperature of 38 degrees or higher)
  - Is low in energy
  - Has diarrhoea or vomiting
  - Cough and sore throat

They should stay at home until those symptoms have finished. A HSE poster has been emailed to parents with advice on when it is safe to return to school.

- 3. Get bedtime back. Try to ensure bedtime is early enough to allow for a good night's sleep.
- 4. Remind kids of the basics. We will be continuing to maintain our now established hygiene routines in school in relation to handwashing.
  - Children will be reminded to adhere to good respiratory etiquette by covering a cough and sneezing into their elbow. It is advisable that each child has a small packet of tissues which can be kept in their bag for their personal use in school.
  - Good **ventilation** will continue to be maintained in all classrooms.
- 5. Vaccination: Making sure your child is up to date on all recommended vaccinations.

# Primary Maths Curriculum Launched-Information For Parents

The Department of Education and Skills (DES) has published a new *Primary Maths Curriculum* for children in primary schools and we have received notification of an <u>additional school</u> <u>closure</u> on **Monday 20th January 2025** to facilitate teacher continuous professional development for the new *Primary Maths Curriculum* which is being implemented in all primary schools from the start of the 2024/2025 school year. <u>The school will be required to close to pupils on that day and will re-open as normal on Tuesday 21st January 2025. The new Primary Maths Curriculum does not change much of 'what' children learn, but it improves 'how' children learn Maths. This includes more learning through play and problem solving. It also provides more opportunities for children to be creative, take</u>

risks and be challenged. The new *Primary Maths Curriculum* is being implemented during the 2024/25 school year.

## **School Attendance**

We would love to see your child in school every day to ensure that they reach their full potential. We understand however, that there may be occasions when your child may be absent for valid reasons. For these days, please provide a reason for your child's absence. We are legally obligated to report all absences over 20 days to **TUSLA**, so it is important that we record all **absence reasons** on our roll system. You can do this using the *Aladdin Connect App*, or alternatively you can contact your child's class teacher via the *School Diary* or email Martina in the school office at <u>office@rathmorens.ie</u>

To help you to keep track of your child's absences you will receive a notification through *Aladdin Connect* if they miss 15 & 20 days of school.

FUSE Anti-Bullying and Online Safety Programme

We welcome the invitation to 4<sup>th</sup>, 5th and 6<sup>th</sup> classes in Rathmore N.S. to take part in the FUSE Anti-Bullying and Online Safety Programme, supported by the Department of Education and Skills and developed by the DCU Anti-Bullying Centre. FUSE is referenced in Cineáltas: Action Plan on Bullying which acknowledges the importance of evidence-based, age-appropriate and culturally relevant anti-bullying programmes such as FUSE.

FUSE is the first research-based Anti-Bullying and Online Safety Programme designed to comply with UNESCO's Whole Education Approach to tackle bullying and online safety issues in schools. It is based on 25 years of research on bullying prevention and intervention and is designed to support the wider SPHE/RSE/Wellbeing curricula in schools. FUSE consists of a suite of student-led workshops and resources delivered by teachers in classroom settings.

At the heart of FUSE is the aim of building capacity in schools to tackle bullying and online safety issues and to empower children and adolescents to understand their own behaviour, be able to recognise bullying and online safety risks and be confident in how to report and seek support when they need it. # Reminder re Pupil Use of Mobile Phones in School

Please note that as per our current school *Acceptable Use Policy*, pupils are discouraged from bringing mobile phones to school but, if necessary for home -school communication, mobile phones <u>must be switched off during the school day and **not used** while on the school premises/grounds. Students are not permitted to use phones/smart watches as cameras under any circumstances in school, on school trips or during extra-curricular activities. The school will not be liable for the replacement of lost, stolen or damaged devices. Pupils who take unauthorised photos or recordings of other students or staff members will face disciplinary action as per the school's Code of Behaviour. The school incorporates this policy into the Code of Behaviour and will treat breaches as they would treat any other breach of the Code.</u>

Parents/Guardians are advised to supervise their child's use of mobile phones outside of school hours and it is advisable that pupils avoid setting up or participating in class *Whatsapp* groups. Please note that the administrator of a *Whatsapp Group* is responsible for the content shared on the chat. There is an ever-increasing body of evidenced-based research which has highlighted the detrimental effects of smartphone and social media use on the brain, especially on the developing young brains of children under the age of 14.

Our **Rathmore N.S**. *Parents Association*, in conjunction with our school management and teachers have announced that they, together with eleven other primary schools in Naas will soon launch a voluntary **Go Phone Free** initiative which offers parents/guardians a tool to help address concerns about their children having access to a smartphone and social media.

# **REMINDERS**

**UNIFORMS:** Please note that the school uniform is inter-changeable and pupils can wear either the uniform or school tracksuit to school. However, all children in 6<sup>th</sup> class who intend receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation are required to wear the <u>full school uniform for Confirmation</u>. Your class teacher will advise on what days P.E. is taking place when your child should wear the school tracksuit. Please ensure that your child has a <u>light</u>, <u>rain-jacket or coat</u> for school and remember to check that all items of school clothing are <u>clearly labelled</u> with your child's name.

GARDA VETTING: As part of Child Protection Guidelines, it is a requirement that all parents helping out with school activities are Garda-vetted. This process is confidential and once the initial application is submitted by the school, the process is online for the applicant. Therefore, parents/guardians who may become involved in school activities such as Sports Days, Tours, Library, School Garden, Matches, Swimming or who wish to help out with children in the school must first be *vetted*.
