Maths Week 2024





The 20th annual *Maths Week* Ireland took place from 12th-20th October 2024 and it is the biggest festival of its kind in the world. The overall aim is to engage in Maths activities which celebrate a positive image of Maths and boost pupil motivation. Maths Week is committed to the spirit of 'Maths for All' and to support children in becoming creative, resilient, cooperative problem solvers.

Special thanks to **Mr. Walsh** for co-ordinating *Maths Week* in our school. All classes took part in a variety of playful and active Maths activities such as outdoor Maths Trails, Estimation competitions using concrete materials which featured estimating the weight of one of the large pumpkins grown in the school garden and a digital Kahoot Team Maths Quiz for the Senior Classes. There was even an active teacher challenge which was won by **Ms. Behan!** Well done to both children and teachers for their efforts in promoting a positive image of Maths for all!

As advised, we are implementing the *Primary Maths Curriculum* in all classes in the school from September of this year and all teachers will be receiving further continuous professional development on 20th January 2025 when the school will close to pupils on that day.

HSE Free Flu Vaccine For Children

The *Health Service Executive* (HSE) is advising parents that all children aged 2 to 17 will be offered the nasal flu vaccine for free. Children are twice as likely to get the flu as adults, so the HSE is offering the vaccine free of charge to all children in this age group. Parents can bring their children to get the vaccine from their GP surgery or pharmacy. The flu spreads easily from person to person and can cause serious illness in children. Every minute counts in school and the good news is that overall school attendance in Rathmore N.S. has **improved** during **September** and **October** of 2024 compared to the same months in 2023. Attendance is recorded daily by your child's class teacher using the online roll book on *Aladdin*. If your child is absent from school, you can update the reason for absence yourself using *Aladdin Connect* and/or inform your child's class teacher with a note in the school diary. A record is also maintained on *Aladdin* of children who are late to school or leave school early. Please contact **Martina**, our school secretary in the school office if you require assistance.

Every school is required by law to submit an **Attendance Report** twice yearly to *TUSLA*, *the Child and Family Agency*. There are two reporting periods in the year – September to December and January to June. We are required to submit a list of all pupils who have missed <u>20 school days</u> for any reason and each absence should be explained. You will receive a letter from the school to advise you if your child has reached 15 and 20 days absence during this school year.
