Dear Parents/Guardians,

I hope that you and your families are well and looking forward to the Hallowe'en Mind-Term break. Each one of us has a duty to protect children from harm and the *Department of Education and Skills* (DES) has recently published the **Child Protection Procedures for Primary Schools (2023 Revised)** to give direction to school management and staff regarding the identification of and response to child protection concerns.

The Board of Management of Scoil Chéile Chríost Rathmore N.S has already adopted these procedures as school policy. A copy of our Child Safeguarding Statement is available to view on the school website or a hard copy is also available to read in the school office. Please note that the Designated Liaison Person (DLP) in place for dealing with child protection concerns is the school Principal, Lucy Travers and the Deputy Designated Liaison Person (DDLP) is the Deputy Principal, Caitríona Lancaster. We appreciate your co-operation with the following procedures which are in place:

- A requirement for **all visitors** to Rathmore N.S. to report to the school *Reception Office* where they will be asked to sign-in and will receive a *'Visitor'* badge.
- Parents/guardians are asked <u>not to proceed</u> directly to classrooms when collecting children early
 from school but to wait at Reception and their child will be escorted to meet them there. Our
 school Secretary <u>Martina</u> is always happy to assist you with any query.
- A reminder that all parents/guardians who are actively involved in any school activities such as the school Library, Tours, Matches and Sports Day activities <u>must be vetted</u>. All details on Diocesan Vetting requirements can be obtained from **Martina** in the School Office.

Hope you all have a very happy and safe Hallowe'en! The school will re-open after the mid-term break on Monday 4th November.

Be Winter Ready!



<u>Be Winter Ready</u>: Please ensure that your child has a <u>light</u>, <u>rain-jacket or coat</u> for school and remember to check that all items of school clothing are <u>clearly labelled</u> with your child's name. As Winter has arrived and the days are getting colder, it is advisable that children put way their shorts and dress for the cold weather outdoors on the school yard by wearing the <u>school track suit bottoms from now on.</u> Inhalers:

If your child has asthma and needs to use an inhaler in school, please remember to send in an indate inhaler which is clearly labelled. This will be kept in our medical press in the school if needed.

Every minute counts in school and the good news is that overall school attendance in Rathmore N.S. has improved during September of 2024 compared to the same month in 2023. Attendance is recorded daily by your child's class teacher using the online roll book on *Aladdin*. If your child is absent from school, you can update the reason for absence yourself using *Aladdin Connect* and/or inform your child's class teacher with a note in the school diary. A record is also maintained on *Aladdin* of children who are late to school or leave school early. Please contact **Martina**, our school secretary in the school office if you require assistance.

Every school is required by law to submit an Attendance Report twice yearly to *TUSLA*, *the Child and Family Agency*. There are two reporting periods in the year – September to December and January to June. We are required to submit a list of all pupils who have missed 20 school days for any reason and each absence should be explained.

The overall aim of school attendance and punctuality procedures is to ensure each child maximises their learning time in school and misses as little time as possible, unless of course, there is a valid reason such as illness and/or medical appointments. Educational Research shows that there is a direct link between school attendance and pupil progress in school. *Parents/Guardians are discouraged from taking their child/children out of school for other reasons during term time*.

Music Generation Kildare











Ms. Malone's and Mr. Walsh's Sixth Classes are taking part in Music Generation Kildare for the 2024/25 school year. Music Generation Kildare (MGK) is Ireland's National Music Education Programme initiated by Music Network, co-funded by Irish band U2, the Ireland Funds and the Department of Education and Skills (DES). It is locally funded here in Kildare by Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board and Kildare County Council.

The children in these classes will participate in weekly music sessions on the **Ukulele** with a trained musician, to run for approximately 28 weeks during this school year. The instruments will be supplied on a rental basis. This presents a great opportunity for the children to learn to play the **Ukulele** and engage creatively in Music education.

School Admissions & Junior Infants Enrolment: School Year 2025-26

Teacher Supply Shortage

There is a continued national teacher supply shortage in Irish primary schools with many schools unable to fill advertised teacher vacancies for this 2024/25 school year and school management bodies and teacher unions have been calling on the Minister of Education to put further alleviation measures in place. Primary schools are also experiencing an acute shortage of available substitute teachers to cover teacher absences where sub cover is provided by the DES. This problem is affecting schools in both the Dublin and commuter counties including Kildare and has been compounded by the cost of rental accommodation.

Fortunately, all advertised teacher vacancies in Rathmore NS were filled by the Board of Management for the 2024-25 school year following a recruitment process during the Summer holidays. However, in common with other schools in Kildare and despite our best efforts, we have been experiencing difficulties in sourcing substitute teachers. We hope that the Department of Education will put further measures in place to support school Management at this challenging time.

New Buddy Benches For the School Yard



There was great excitement when **Paul**, our School Caretaker took delivery of 2 new **Buddy Benches** last week and positioned them on the school yard. The **Buddy Benches** are sturdy and colourful and are made from recycled plastic in keeping with our sustainability policy. They provide a safe space to sit and chat and make new friends and are a welcome addition to the school yard. We are very grateful to our **Parents Association** for funding the benches and to parent **Jane Byrne** for organising the purchase and delivery to the school. The feedback from the children has been excellent so far too!

National Tree Day/ Lá a gCrann 2024




